

<u>Former BAE Woodford - Demolition and Regeneration</u> <u>Update 03 - June 2015</u>

Demolition has progressed well since our April update with the first phase handed over to Redrow in May. Redrow are now commencing works in this north eastern area of the site, starting with site infrastructure.

The rest of the demolition of the northern part of the site has continued to progress in a westerly direction. The former Canteen building has now been completely demolished and the former offices at Avro House are now well under demolition. The remaining floor slab of the former Main Hangar has been cleared of materials and work will re-commence on removing the slab and crushing the concrete for re-use.

The remediation work to the hydrocarbon contamination associated with the storage of Jet A1 aviation fuel has been undertaken and completed and work on a further area will commence once accessible.

Demolition work will continue in the northern area moving westward. We anticipate work will be complete in the northern area in August 2015 after which work will commence in the southern part of the site and is scheduled to be complete in December 2015.

The recycled material produced on site will be used by Redrow in their first phase construction.

We are continuing to monitor dust, noise and vibrations and we are liaising regularly with the Environmental Health Team at Stockport MBC. We also continue to have regular meetings with representatives of the Woodford Community Council and Woodford Neighbourhood Forum.


